DEATH OF THE REV. J. PULVER.—We regret to have to record the death, at the advanced age of seventy years, of the Rev. J. Pulver, who has been a resident of Hobart Town for the last two years, and who held the position of Rabbi in the Jewish congregation here for over a twelvemonth. Mr. Pulver died on Friday, after a long and painful illness, and his decease is deeply regretted by all those who were members of his congregation. The funeral took place on Sunday afternoon, the Rev. A. Meyer officiating. This is the first Jewish funeral that has taken place in the new country. Mr. Pulver, who was compelled to give up his office as Rabbi here through ill health, held similar positions in Melbourne and Chelmsford in England, and was assumed one of the most ability of the Rabbis in the Australian colonies.

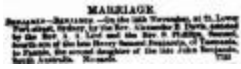
## Meeting Minutes, 7 October 1873 (1973)
