HOBART CENTENARY CELEBRATED

Signs of Growth
The August 18th the Hobart Hebrew Congregation celebrated its centenary. To mark the occasion a dinner was held at the Belvedere, Hobart, at which the greater part of the Jewish community was present. When 1000 men gathered from towns above that the early community in Tasmania was a flourishing and prosperous one. In the course of the evening the congregation, owing to Jewish migration to the mainland, dwindled rapidly. It is thanks mainly to the work of Mr. Robert Benjamin, the present president, who has kept the synagogue open regularly for the traditional Sabbath services, that this smallest congregation, the oldest in the Commonwealth, has not passed into oblivion. In recent years the congregation has again shown signs of growth, as a result of some influx from overseas and the mainland.

HOBART SYNAGOGUE 100 YEARS OLD.

The 100th anniversary of the laying of the foundation stone of the Hobart Synagogue was marked by the congregation with a dinner and reception at Belvedere on 18th August. The function was attended by 10 to 150 congregational members of the congregation and visitors. Mr. R. Benjamin and Mr. John Benjamin were making speeches.

The stone of the synagogue, which stands in Apple Street, was laid by the then president of the congregation (Mr. Lewis Nathan) on August 18th, 1843, and the building was completed and dedicated on June 27, 1943. It is claimed to be the oldest synagogue in Australia. In a unique style of Egyptian architecture, the building has been associated with interest by many architects.

Rev. Isaac Kahan, of Melbourne, conducted a Sabbath service at the synagogue on Saturday and attended the function last night.



MRS SILVERMAN ENTERTAINED

Mrs Archibald Silverman representing the Zionist Federation of Australia was the guest of honour at a luncheon ordered at West Pl. Riviera Hotel Hobart, on Saturday by women of the Synagogue with Mrs V. A. Cohen, wife of the president of the Hobart Hebrew congregation at her own expense.

A talk on children entering Palestine through the International Jewish Organisation, known as Youth Aliyah, was given by Mrs Silverman. She said about 12,000 children had been rescued from Europe through the organisation, which was sponsored by the Jewish Agency for Palestine. Jewish women were helping to raise funds for the rescue of Jewish children in practically every free Jewish community in the world, and a committee was being formed in Hobart to help with the work.

HOBART WIZO: During Mrs. Wynn's recent visit to Hobart on holiday, a new WIZO Group was organised in this small community which is only just beginning to come to life again with the influx of new settlers from Europe. While Hobart is actually the home of the first Jewish Synagogue in this part of the world, it was forced to close its doors for many years and was only just opened again recently. Now there are about 20 Jewish families who are struggling to maintain a communal life, and who welcome any interest taken in their Jewish coherence. A Rabbi and Jewish teacher are sorely needed and never was the task of central rabbinical authority in Australia so keenly felt as in this small group of Jews completely forgotten by Australian Jewry except for purposes of fund raising. I trust that the founding of a WIZO, concerned not with fund raising but with bringing about a spirit of co-operation amongst the members and in making them feel a part of the whole House of Israel, will bring the community together into a more closely welded unit. The Office-bearers are: Mrs. Censel, President; Mrs. Fisel, Hon. Secretary; Mrs. Frank, Hon. Treasurer; Mrs. Hara Jacobs, Chairman of Functions; Mrs. Abramovsky, Chairman of Children's Committee. Mr. and Mrs. S. Wynn were hosts to members of the Jewish Community at a delightful social gathering at the West Point Hotel.



This Day of Atonement will be observed by Jews in Hobart from 10 to 12 October, 1946. The Day of Atonement is the holiest of the Jewish religious festivals. It is a day of fasting and prayer, and is observed by Jews in all parts of the world. The Jews of Hobart will observe this day with special devotion. The day will be marked by a service at the Jewish Synagogue at 8.15 p.m. on the 10th of October. The service will be conducted by the Rabbi, and will include prayers, readings, and a sermon. The day will also be marked by a fast, and by the wearing of white garments. The Jews of Hobart are invited to attend the service and to observe the fast.

Jews' Peace Work Praised
