RESTITUTION from  
GERMANY

proposed,  
The E.C.A.J. submitted the text of a resolution regarding  
Policy on Jewish claims against Germany. This matter is  
to be discussed at a Conference on Jewish Claims, to be  
held in New York on 14th January, and directions have to  
be sent to the representative of the E.C.A.J. Dr. Perlzweig.  
The question is whether negotiations are to be ~~held~~ conducted  
direct with Germany or through the United Nations.  
The E.C.A.J. expresses the view that negotiations should  
be conducted NOT direct with Germany, but through the  
United Nations.

After a lengthy discussion the following resolution was  
adopted: "Not being familiar with the subject the Hobart  
Hebrew Congregation is prepared to follow the lead given  
by Melbourne that negotiations be conducted through the  
United Nations." moved by Mr. H. Jacob, seconded by Mr.  
Epstein. (voting 4 in favour, 2 against).
