

Annual General Meeting of the Hobart Hebrew Congregation held at the Synagogue
Chambers on Sunday May 13th 1917

Present

Mr B. Harris (Chair) Messrs R. Benjamin, Geo. Benjamin, J. Levy. M. Davis, S. Newman, D. Glasser, Joseph Benjamin and the Hon Sec Nat Edwards and D. Mendes

Mr. N. Edwards informed the meeting that he held proxy from Mr. J. Glasser, Mr. Paul Glasser, Mr. M. Joseph and Mr. Geo Levy to act on their behalf.

Proposed by J. Benjamin and seconded by N. Edwards that Messrs I. Levy and D. Mendes be appointed auditors to examine the yearly balance sheet. Carried.

The financial statement having been read and the balance sheet produced it was proposed by M. Nat Edwards and seconded by I. Levy that the same be adopted and confirmed - (carried unanimously)

Proposed by N. Edwards and seconded by I. Levy that the following officers be elected for the ensuing year ending May 1918, President M. B. Harris Vice President Mr. J. Glasser, Treasurer Mr. Reuben Benjamin, Committee Messrs Geo Benjamin and Sol Newman, Carried unanimously.

Proposed by J. Levy, seconded by J. Benjamin and carried unanimously, That Mr Nat Edwards be elected honorary Secretary for the year ending May 1918.

The resolution standing in the name of Nat Edwards "that any resident of Hobart who shall absent himself from attending Divine Service continuously for six months shall cease to be a member of the Congregation" was withdrawn by that gentleman.

Proposed by Nat Edwards and seconded by J. Levy "That this meeting note the great interest taken by our Minister the Rev I. Morris in all matters appertaining to the affairs of the H.H.Cong' and fully recognise his undoubted zeal and ability, and are pleased to place on record their appreciation of same - Carried unanimously.

Proposed by Mr. Benjamin and seconded by J. Levy that a vote of thanks be passed to the Hon Secretary Mr. Nat Edwards for his attention to all matters concerning the interests of the Hobart Hebrew Congregation – Carried unanimously.

Proposed by Jos Benjamin and seconded by Geo Benjamin "that this meeting regret that Mr. Glasser the Vice Chairman is compelled to leave Hobart for the benefit of his health and sincerely trust that under Divine Providence he may soon return in perfect health and be

able to resume his many good deeds on behalf of the Jewish Community Carried unanimously.

An hearty vote of thanks to the chairman. Closed the proceedings
